

The Federated Malay States Postal Stationery

- Pg 1. FREE. Card from the Perak Recreation Club (P.R.C.) used from Thaipeng showing the free postage for locally printed cards/newspapers sent within the Straits Settlements and Malay States from 1st July 1888 to 31st Dec 1893.
S.S. QV 1-cent green post card over printed "PERAK" used from Thaipeng on 10 January 1887 to Penang, showing the earliest record usage of this card.
- Pg 2. S.S. QV 3-cents blue post card used from Klang, Selangor on 16th December 1887 to Holland, showing the usage of Straits Settlements postal stationery required for mail to UPU countries.
S.S. QV 3-cents post card overprinted "TWO CENTS" used from Kuala Pilah, Negri Sembilan on 14 December 1892 to Switzerland, with the earliest known date from this post office.
- Pg 3. S.S. QV 3-cents carmine post card used from Seremban on 4 April 1897 to Germany, with the earliest known date of Seremban postmark.
S.S. QV 3-cents carmine reply post card used from Japan on 9 September 1898 back to Selangor.
- Pg 4. 1892 De La Rue Master Die Proof of the Impress Stamp of the native states issue used for Post Card.
1899 De La Rue Essay of the Pahang 1-cent post card with handwritten "PAHANG" on Chinese white ink.
- Pg 5. Perak 1-cent green post card with British Coat of Arms used from Kampar on 30 October 1894 to Ipoh.
Pahang 1-cent post card uprated with additional 2-cents stamp used from Kuala Lipis on 11 November 1899 to Sarawak, showing that the Malay States stamp were valid for usage to oversea destination after joining UPU.
Selangor 1-cent reply post card uprated with additional 2 x 1-cent FMS stamp used from Klang on 19 November 1901 to England, showing the combination usage during the transition period.
- Pg 6. 28 December 1900 De La Rue Essay in near adopted design of the 1-cent unified leaping tiger definitive issue.
- Pg 7. 2-cents brown post card used from Paul Street, Seremban on 17 June 1926 to Medan in Netherlands East Indies underpaid and taxed with 20 centimes, collected 10 cents postage due on arrival.
4-cents overprinted on 3-cents carmine post card used from Kuala Lumpur on 18 July 1923 to Bahamas in British West Indies hand-stamped with 1924 British Empire Exhibition Slogan mark.
- Pg 8. 12 June 1928 De La Rue Die Proof in issued color of the 4-cents orange embossed envelope.
4-cents embossed envelope uprated with 4 x 1-cent stamp to Scotland, posted on train and hand-stamped with the rectangle violet 'TRAIN LETTER' mark and further canceled at train destination in Penang on 29 October 1929.
- Pg 9. 22 May 1928 De La Rue Die Proof in issued color of the 2-cents green newspaper wrapper.
2-cents newspaper wrapper used from Kuala Lumpur on 2 April 1931 to Missouri, USA.
- Pg 10. 22 May 1928 De La Rue Die Proof in issued color of the 4-cents orange letter card without perforation.
4-cents letter card uprated with 4-cents & 25-cents stamps used from Batu Tiga, Selangor to UK on 13 May 1932 paying 8-cents surface rate and 25-cents air fee by Imperial Airway accelerated 'Karachi to London' service.
- Pg 11. 5-cents registration fee paid Size F envelope uprated with 5-cents, 10-cents and S.S. 1-cent stamp used from Kwala Lumpur on 20 July 1901 to France, showing combination usage during the transition/stamp shortage period.
10-cents registration fee paid Size G envelope uprated with 8-cents stamp used from Kota Bharu, Perak on 2 March 1917 to Sumatra in Netherlands East Indies. Showing Penang WW 1 censor and label with various transit and NI postal agent mark.
- Pg 12. 15-cents registration fee paid Size H envelope uprated with 10-cents and 30-cents stamp used from Teluk Anson on 15 November 1935 to Denmark.
